Instructions

Start reading at the very beginning of the book of Psalms. When you find the short phrase for each day, write down the chapter and verse in the blanks provided. The next day, continue reading from where you stopped the day before.

The distance you read to find each entry will vary. On average, it'll be about 43 verses per day, but it may occasionally be as short as 20, or as long as 68 verses.

When you reach the end of a book, check the next day to see which book you should start reading next. You'll jump back and forth between the Old and New Testaments, and between history, prophecy, and instruction. By the time you finish the entire booklet, you'll have read through over half of the Bible... 15,556 verses in all.
