Instructions

Start reading at the beginning of the book of Isaiah. When you find the short phrase for each day, write down the book, chapter, and verse in the blanks provided. The next day, continue reading from where you stopped the day before.

The distance you read to find each entry will vary. On average, it’ll be about 85 verses per day, but it may occasionally be as short as 40, or as long as 128 verses.

When you reach the end of a book, check the top of the section to see which book you should start reading next. You’ll jump back and forth between the Old and New Testaments, and between history, prophecy, and instruction. By the time you finish the entire booklet, you’ll have read through the entire Bible once... all 31,102 verses of it.
